SECTION 1 VARIETAL CLASSIFICATION CASCADES

The following lists the varietal classification cascades for wheat to be used for the purposes of determining the maximum grade to which a variety may belong. This table is to be included in support of the 2008/09 Varietal Master List:

1. APH / AH / APW / ASW / AUH / AGP / AUW / FEED
2. AH / APW / ASW / AUH / AGP / AUW / FEED
3. APW / ASW / AGP / AUW / FEED
4. ASW / AGP / AUW / FEED
5. AGP / AUW / FEED
6. ASF1 (SFE1) / AGP / AUW / FEED
7. ASWN / AGP / AUW / FEED
8. ADR/FEED

Rules to Apply:

- a) The maximum varietal classification must comply with the most up to date Varietal Master List
- b) The maximum varietal classification is to be read from left to right in the above table, as this reflects the highest to lowest grade
- c) FEED variety includes Red and Spring Feed wheat varieties
- d) Where classified as an APWT variety, varieties follow cascading rules as per APW unless otherwise indicated in the Varietal Master List.

SECTION 2 BIN GRADE CASCADES

B. Bin Grade Cascades

The following lists the bin/receival grade cascading rules for wheat to be used for the purposes of determining the grade to which a delivery may be received during the 2008/09 season:

1. APH2 / H1 / H2 / APW1 / APW2 / ASW1 / AUH2 / AGP1 / AUW1 / HPS1 / SFW1 / FED1
2. H1 / H2 / APW1 / APW2 / ASW1 / AUH2 / AGP1 / AUW1 / HPS1 / SFW1 / FED1
3. APW1 / APW2 / ASW1 / AGP1 / AUW1 / HPS1 / SFW1 / FED1
4. ASW1 / AGP1 / AUW1 / HPS1 / SFW1 / FED1
5. AGP1 / AUW1 / HPS1 / SFW1 / FED1
6. SFT1 (SFE1) / SFT2 (SFE2) / ANW2 / AGP1 / AUW1 / HPS1 / SFW1 / FED1
7. ANW1 / ANW2 / AGP1 / AUW1 / SFW1 / FED1
8. DR1 / DR2 / DR3 / FED1

Rules to Apply:

- a) The maximum bin grade classification is to be read from left to right in the above table as this reflects the highest to lowest grade
- b) Deliveries must meet relevant Standards to be able to be classified into that bin grade
- c) If the segregation is not available, the next bin grade will apply if the grain is delivered unless other requirements are stated in the relevant Storage & Handling Agreement
- d) Note that not all bin grades implemented during the 2008/09 season may be listed in the above table.
